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The Opportunity



The Programme offers:

- Training to get you ready for work **below-the-line** as **crew**
- Support before and during your work placement

EXPLANATION

Crew: The people behind the camera who make the film or TV show (i.e. not the actors). The crew work in lots of different departments such as accounts, costume, production, or locations.

Below-the-Line: behind-the scenes jobs that are NOT Director, Writer or Producer.



As part of the scheme, there will be lots of chances to meet with crew members from Warner Bros. Discovery film and TV productions.

Sometimes, it will also be possible to interview for paid work on productions.

To be able to apply, you must:

- Be 18 and over
- Have achieved maths and English GCSE at grade 4 or over
- Have the right to live and work in the UK

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How to apply



STEP 1 - the application form:

- Apply online using the application form.
- First there are questions about you – please let us know if you need adjustments or have any needs we can support with.
- There are then two questions where you can choose whether to type an answer or make an audio file.



STEP 2 – the interview:

- If you are shortlisted for an interview, you will receive an email to let you know and to ask for your CV.
- The interview will be on Zoom and will last around 20 minutes.



STEP 3 – the assessment day:

- If you are selected for the assessment day stage, you will receive an email.
- The assessment day will be attended in person. All expenses will be covered.



It is likely that interviews and assessment days will take place during April and May 2024.
